Yard Move

Yard move is designed for those moments when the driver is moving his truck for work purposes, but this is not really "driving". An example of this is when the driver have been asked to move a few metres in a parking lot or he is picking up a load and he needs to get a bit closer to the loading dock.

Examples of properties that may qualify as yards include, but are not limited to:

- ☐ An intermodal yard or port facility.
- ☐ A motor carrier's place of business.
- ☐ A shipper's privately owned parking lot.
- A public road, but only if and while public access to the road is restricted through traffic control measures such as lights, gates, flaggers or other means. For example, if a driver must operate on a public road briefly to reach different parts of a private property, the movement may be considered a yard move if public access is restricted during the move.

Examples of properties that do not qualify as yards include a public road without the traffic control measures mentioned above, or public rest areas.
